

**REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FROM SERVICE PROVIDERS TO PROVIDE TRADE AND INVESTMENT  
KWAZULU-NATAL (TIKZN) WITH A CATHSSETA ACCREDITED HOSPITALITY TRAINING PROGRAM  
IN UMHLABUYALINGANA**

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## 1. INTRODUCTION

Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal (TIKZN) is a provincial trade and investment promotion public entity, mandated by the Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (DEDTEA) to promote the province as an investment destination and to promote trade by assisting KwaZulu-Natal (KZN) based companies to identify local and international markets to export their products.

## 2. BACKGROUND

The Skills Development and Tourism Programme (SDTP) is an internship / experiential hospitality programme targeting the unemployed youth of South Africa as part of the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) of the National Department of Tourism (NDT). The programme covers theory and workplace training which lead to the attainment of an accredited skills programme accredited by Culture, Art, Tourism, Hospitality & Sport Sector Education and Training Authority (CATHSSETA).

TIKZN has been mandated by the National Department of Tourism (NDT) to implement and manage the Umhlabuyalingana Hospitality Skills and Tourism Development Programme, hence TIKZN is seeking the service provider to train learners on Hospitality Skills and Tourism Development Programme in the uMhlabuyalingana area.

The preferred bidder will be selected based on its functionality response and shall be remunerated based on the EPWP grant conditions. In this regard, the preferred bidder shall be required to enter into a Service Level Agreement (SLA) that will oversee the scope of the professional service as well as the training component, which shall include all deliverables as stated in the TIKZN Grant Agreement with NDT.

NDT through the Working for Tourism Programme, funds and implements the Tourism programme which are aligned to the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP). The latter is a South African Government initiated programme aimed at drawing a significant number of unemployed South Africans into productive work in a manner that would enable them to gain skills and increase their capacity to earn income as well as to contribute in developing their communities and country. The programme is implemented in all spheres of government, across four defined sectors, namely the Infrastructure, Social, Non-State and Environment and Culture sectors and advances the principle of government expenditure to provide employment opportunities and skills development to the unemployed. Phase three to the EPWP aims to create 6 million job opportunities and 2.6 million full time equivalent (FTEs) jobs by March 2019.

## 3. PROJECT OBJECTIVE AND PURPOSE

The objective of the training programme is to train the unemployed youth to enable them to acquire skills and gain work experience to enhance employability in the hospitality and tourism sector.

The purpose of this tender is to procure from an accredited service provider to train learners on Hospitality Skills and Tourism Development programme in Umhlabuyalingana area. The following are deliverables expected from the service provider in rolling out this project:

- 3.1 Conduct a hospitality and tourism skills gap analysis within Umhlabuyalingana municipality.
- 3.2 Develop a tourism job opportunity report that has a potential of match-making trained learners with employers.
- 3.3 Provide training material, equipment and uniforms that will be required and used by 60 identified learners.

- 3.4 Train 60 identified learners on relevant Hospitality Skills and Tourism Development programme under CATHSSETA accreditation.
- 3.5 Arrange a graduation ceremony to award certificates of competence to those who pass the course.
- 3.6 Facilitate a recruitment process for qualified learners with the available employers.

A series of accredited training courses are proposed which are subject to change depending on the outcome of the skills analyses report. The program may include but not limited to:

- (a) Assistant Chef Program
- (b) Tourist Guiding (Nature and cultural)
- (c) General Tourist Assistant Program
- (d) Customer service Program
- (e) Food and drink service attendant Program
- (f) Room attendant
- (g) Table Attendant
- (h) General Business Skills
- (i) Health and Safety
- (j) General Food Preparation Program
- (k) Hospitality Reception
- (l) Laundry Assistant
- (m) Kitchen Cleaner

#### **4. SERVICE PROVIDER'S TERMS OF REFERENCE**

It is the intention of TIKZN to enter into a formal Service Level Agreement with the successful Service Provider to provide the services described in this document.

The Terms of Reference (TOR) would serve to guide the process of selecting and appointing a qualified service provider by ensuring a match between TIKZN's requirements and the knowledge and experience of the service provider.

These TOR's and the service provider's proposal will form the basis of the service level agreement to be entered into between the parties.

#### **5. SCOPE OF SERVICES**

The service provider will be expected to do the following:

- a) Conduct a hospitality and tourism skills gap analysis within Umhlabuyalingana municipality.
- b) Develop a hospitality and tourism skills development program taking into account the outcomes of the analysis report. The training program should encompass unit standards which falls under the CATHSSETA.
- c) Work with relevant stakeholders to develop a criterion to identify potential learners to participate on the program.
- d) Identify or source tourism business establishments that will be willing to provide 4 months experiential learning to the learners.
- e) Recruit 60 unemployed youth as learners and participants to the program.
- f) Implement the training program (facilitation, assessment, portfolio of evidence and moderation) for a period of not less than 10 months including the 4 months of experiential learning (the program will provide weekly stipend, to be determined by TIKZN, to the learners during the entire program duration).

The service provider will be expected to administer and ensure that the weekly stipend is only paid to learners that are actively participants in the program (proof of attendance and participation to be provided)

- g) Provide training venue, material, equipment and uniforms that will be required and used by 60 identified learners.  
Uniform – Provision of two sets of learner uniform branded with Department of Tourism, EPWP and TIKZN logos and comply with 100% minimum threshold for local content and production of textile, clothing, leather and footwear. The declaration and annexures/schedules of local content and production will be given to the appointed bidder prior to the procurement of uniform items. The uniform shall consist of 2 short sleeves and 2 long sleeves shirts, 1 jacket and 1 school bag.
- h) Develop a monitoring and evaluation tools to assess progress and achievement during experiential learning.
- i) Certification of learners and host a graduation and certification event.  
Provide monthly reporting to TIKZN and quarterly reporting to the Project Steering Committee.
- j) Facilitate a recruitment process for qualified learners with the available employers ensuring that at least 40% (24) trained learners are permanently employed.
- k) Provide close out report.

The timeframe of this contract is a period of 14 months commencing from the date of appointment i.e. the signing of the Service Level Agreement (SLA). The 14 months is inclusive of gap analysis studies, job opportunity report, theory training, experiential learning and project close out.

## **6. METHODOLOGY**

The methodology for project implementation must clearly indicate how the service provider intends to execute the following projects deliverables:

- a. Hospitality & Tourism Skills Gap Analysis
- b. Develop a Hospitality & Tourism Skills Development Programme
- c. Develop the learner selection criteria
- d. Select the unemployed potential learners
- e. Identify tourism business establishments to participate in experiential learning
- f. Implementation of a training programme
- g. Implementation of the experiential programme  
Payment and payroll management for learner's stipends
- h. Graduation and certification
- i. Facilitate a recruitment process for qualified learners with the available employers
- j. Monitoring and Evaluation

## **7. PROJECT STEERING COMMITTEE**

TIKZN shall establish a Projects Steering Committee (PSC) constituting of senior management and representatives of the National Department of Tourism. The appointed service provider is expected to undertake all administrative functions for the meetings viz: Agenda, Meeting Notifications, Attendance Register, Minutes and Reports etc. The PSC meets on quarterly basis and when required.

## **8. INSTRUCTION TO SERVICE PROVIDERS**

The services required by Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal are described in these ToR and therefore all applicable annexures which are listed as mandatory must be comprehensively covered in your proposal.

### **8.1. ALTERATIONS OR WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS**

Service Providers may withdraw their proposals by written notification on or before the closing date.

### **8.2. COMPULSORY BRIEFING SESSION**

a) No compulsory briefing session is required for this project.

### **8.3. COSTS FOR PREPARATION OF RFP / RFQ PROPOSAL**

The costs incurred by the Service Provider in respect of the attendance of any briefing or presentation meetings or costs incurred in preparing any proposal will be borne by the Service Provider and Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal shall in no way be liable to reimburse the Service Provider for such costs incurred.

### **8.4. OWNERSHIP OF RFP / RFQ AND PRESENTATIONS**

TIKZN shall on receipt of any proposal relating to this RFP / RFQ and submitted in accordance with this RFP / RFQ procedure, become the owner thereof and Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal shall not be obliged to return any proposals to Service Providers who request such a return.

### **8.5. CONFIDENTIALITY**

The entire process of calling for proposals as initiated by Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal in terms of its procurement policy is confidential. All deliberations in respect of the acceptability or otherwise of the proposals shall be conducted in closed sessions and members of the Evaluation, Bid Adjudication and Procurement Committee is bound by confidentiality.

### **8.6. ETHICS**

Any attempt by a Service Provider to obtain confidential information or enter into unlawful agreements with competitors or influence the Evaluation and / or the Bid Adjudication and / or Procurement Committee of Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal during the process of examining, evaluating and comparing proposals will lead to the rejection of its proposal in its entirety. The Service Provider must declare any business or other interests it has with Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal or any employee of Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal, failing which the Service Provider shall be automatically disqualified from further participation in the RFP / RFQ.

### **8.7. CANCELLATION OF BID PROCEDURE**

Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal shall be entitled, within its sole and entire discretion, to cancel this RFP / RFQ at any time and shall notify the Service Providers accordingly. Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal shall in no way be liable for any damages whatsoever, including, without limitation, damages for loss of profit, in any way connected with the cancellation of this RFP / RFQ procedure. The publication of an invitation to call for proposals does not commit Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal to appoint any of the qualifying Service Providers.

## **9. REQUIRED EXPERTISE AND COMPETENCIES**

The Service Provider's proposal must outline the expertise and competencies on offer and should expressly detail their previous experience in dealing with projects of this nature. This must be supported by the CV's of the team or managers. To achieve the scope of work, the service provider appointed to undertake this project, should demonstrate the following key competencies:

- a) Comprehensive knowledge and proven track record of provision of Hospitality Skills and Tourism Development services, expertise and experience;
- b) The service provider must be CATHSSETA accredited;
- c) Capacity, expertise and applicable resources to render the services throughout the contract period;
- d) The service provider must have relevant experience and expertise in working on EPWP projects;
- e) The service provider must be financially stable with sufficient key human resources and systems in place.

The prospective training providers/bidders must submit CVs of the personnel assigned for the project as follows:

- At least 1 overall Project Manager
- At least 2 Project Facilitators
- At least 1 Project Assessor
- At least 1 Project Moderator
- At least 1 Admin/ Finance person

#### **10. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION**

Service Providers are required to submit the following documents:

- a) An original valid Tax Clearance Certificate must be submitted with the bid proposal. (Failure to submit the original and valid Tax Clearance Certificate will result in the invalidation of the bid proposal. Certified copies of the Tax Clearance Certificate will not be acceptable). In bids where Consortia /Joint Ventures/Sub-contractors are involved each party must submit a separate valid Tax Clearance Certificate.
- b) Verifiable references.
- c) B-BBEE Verification Certificate (would be an advantage).
- d) Annexure A - STANDARD BID DOCUMENT FORM (SBD1).
- e) Annexure B - DECLARATION OF INTEREST FORM (SBD4).
- f) Annexure C - PREFERENTIAL POINTS CLAIM FORM (SBD6.1).
- g) Annexure E - PRICING SCHEDULE FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES FORM (SBD3.1).
- h) Annexure G - CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDANT BID DETERMINATION FORM (SBD9).
- i) Annexure H - AUTHORITY TO SIGN A BID FORM.

#### **11. PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT**

In compliance with the preferential public procurement laws applicable to Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal and in terms of Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal's procurement policy, preferential points will be awarded to Service Providers who demonstrate BEE in its management and ownership structures. In this regard Service Providers are required to expressly cover this in their proposals and state their BEE management and ownership status. Service providers should also include specific accreditation information where applicable.

NB: Companies must define whether they comply with the following categories of targeted groups:

- Black African owned and percentage owned
- Women owned entities and percentage owned
- Youth owned entities and percentage owned

**12. SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT**

- a) The acceptance of any proposal shall only be confirmed with the conclusion of a written service level agreement between Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal and the Successful Service Provider, in terms of which the rights and duties of the parties are recorded, which agreement shall regulate the relationship between Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal and the Successful Service Provider.
- b) Until such time that an appropriate service level agreement has been concluded between Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal and successful Service Provider, no rights shall be conferred, nor shall any legitimate expectations be conferred to the successful Service Provider to carry out the works or services provided for in this call for proposals.

**13. FEE STRUCTURE**

Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal reserve the right to negotiate any aspect of the proposed fees and disbursements with the preferred Service Provider and shall not to bind to the fees and disbursements submitted by any Service Provider. The fee structure should include standard modules as stipulated in 1.1 from (a) to (m).

**14. EVALUATION CRITERIA**

Evaluation will be carried out on the Functionality and the Preferential Point System (B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution and Price). The following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

- a) The 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).
- b) The 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

**14.1. VALUE OF BID**

The value of this bid is estimated not to exceed R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included) and therefore the 80/20 system shall be applicable.

**14.2. PREFERENCE POINTS**

The preference points awarded for this bid shall be for:

- a) Price and B-BBEE status level of contribution.
- b) The maximum 100 points which includes the Price and the B-BBEE status level of contribution.

**14.3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM**

- a) The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- b) Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts.
- c) Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- d) In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.

- e) However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- f) Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

**15. THE AWARDING OF POINTS**

For the 80/20 or the 90/10 preference point systems, the awarding of points will be done for Price, Functionality and B-BBEE status level of contribution.

**15.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE**

For the 80/20 or the 90/10 preference point systems, a maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

- $P_s$  = Points scored for comparative price of bid under consideration

**15.2. FUNCTIONALITY**

The below mentioned criteria will guide the evaluation of functionality / technical phase and bidders who score less than 70% in this phase will be disqualified for the next phase of evaluation.

### 15.3. B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION

In terms of Regulation 6 (2) and 7 (2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded to a bidder for attaining the B-BBEE status level of contribution in accordance with the table below:

15.3.1. Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a sworn affidavit issued by the EME representative and attested by a Commissioner of Oaths.

- 15.3.2.** A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 15.3.3.** A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 15.3.4.** Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 15.3.5.** A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 15.3.6.** A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprises that does not have equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned unless the contract is subcontracted to an EME that has the capability and ability execute the sub-contract.

**16. B-BBEE STATUS LEVEL OF CONTRIBUTION CLAIMED**

Bidders who claim points in respect of B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution must complete Annexure C: Preferential Points Claim Form. (Points claimed must be in accordance with the table reflected in paragraph 9.3. and must be substantiated by means of a B-BBEE certificate issued by a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS).

**17. CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS**

The acceptance of any proposal shall only be confirmed with the conclusion of a written service level agreement between Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal and the Successful Service Provider, in terms of which the rights and duties of the parties are recorded, which agreement shall regulate the relationship between the Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal and the Successful Service Provider.

Until such time that an appropriate service level agreement has been concluded between Trade & Investment KwaZulu-Natal and successful Service Provider, no rights shall be conferred, nor shall any legitimate expectations be conferred to the successful Service Provider to carry out the works or services provided for in this call for proposals.

**18. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

Copyright, patent rights and other similar rights in any works or products created as a result of the performance of this tender and its assignments shall vest in and are hereby transferred to TIKZN, unless specifically agreed otherwise, in the form of individual written Agreement signed by both parties.

For this purpose only, all works created in terms of this tender and the assignments thereof shall be deemed to have been created under the control and direction of TIKZN. All information documents, records and books provided by TIKZN to any service provider in connection with the proposal or otherwise are strictly private and confidential. Any proposer to any third party shall not disclose them, except with the express consent of TIKZN, which shall be granted in writing prior to such disclosure. TIKZN however reserves the right to disclose any information provided by any service provider to any of the members of TIKZN.

**19. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT**

TIKZN reserves the right to terminate the award of any tender to any party if there are reasonable grounds for considering that there is non-performance by the contractor in terms of the contract. TIKZN also reserves the right to curtail the scope of any tender awarded or to curtail any aspect of any tender. In the event of any such cancellation or curtailment, the tenderer shall have no claim or recourse against TIKZN, of whatsoever nature, save the recoupment of the tenderer's actual and reasonable costs already expended on the project.

**20. SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS**

**ANNEXURE G: CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION FORM (SBD 9)**
